SUBJECT: 305 AMW Critical Information and Indicator List (CIIL)

1. The purpose of this memorandum is to provide the information and indicators that are considered critical with applicable protection measures to all 305th Air Mobility Wing personnel. This CIIL will be used throughout the 305 AMW.
2. Per AFI 10-701, a unit CIIL is developed and procedures are in place to control access to associated information and indicators. All 305 AMW personnel (military and civilian) and contractors who have access to critical information and indicators require a general knowledge of threats, vulnerabilities and their responsibilities associated with protecting it. It is important to understand that information derived from this CIIL is Controlled Unclassified Information and must be protected from inadvertent disclosure.
3. Critical Information: Specific facts (or evidence) about friendly intentions, capabilities, and activities needed by adversaries to plan and act effectively against friendly mission accomplishments.
4. Indicator: In operations security usage, data derived from friendly detectable actions and open-source information that an adversary can interpret and piece together to reach conclusions or estimates of friendly intentions, capabilities, or activities.
